How to go on an adventure...

Go with Charlotte the Marmot on the Creusaz pathway and discover how humans protected themselves against natural hazards. You will learn something about the fauna, the flora and the history of this place.

Before starting your adventure, find out how Charlotte got to La Creusaz. By strolling all along the pathway, you will find 9 information panels; the locations are indicated on the aerial photos within the leaflet.

Please make you sure to have a **pencil** for writing your answers on the leaflet

At least 2 hours are required to traverse the pathway (there and back) with your family or with your friends.

At the end of the itinerary, you will find the answer sheet at the restaurant.

If you have some questions, do not hesitate to ask for information at **the tourist office in Marécottes** or at the **restaurant of La Creusaz**. Have a nice stroll with Charlotte.

Get your **trail passport**, which will allow you to validate your route and win a prize once you have completed 4 Charlotte trails.
